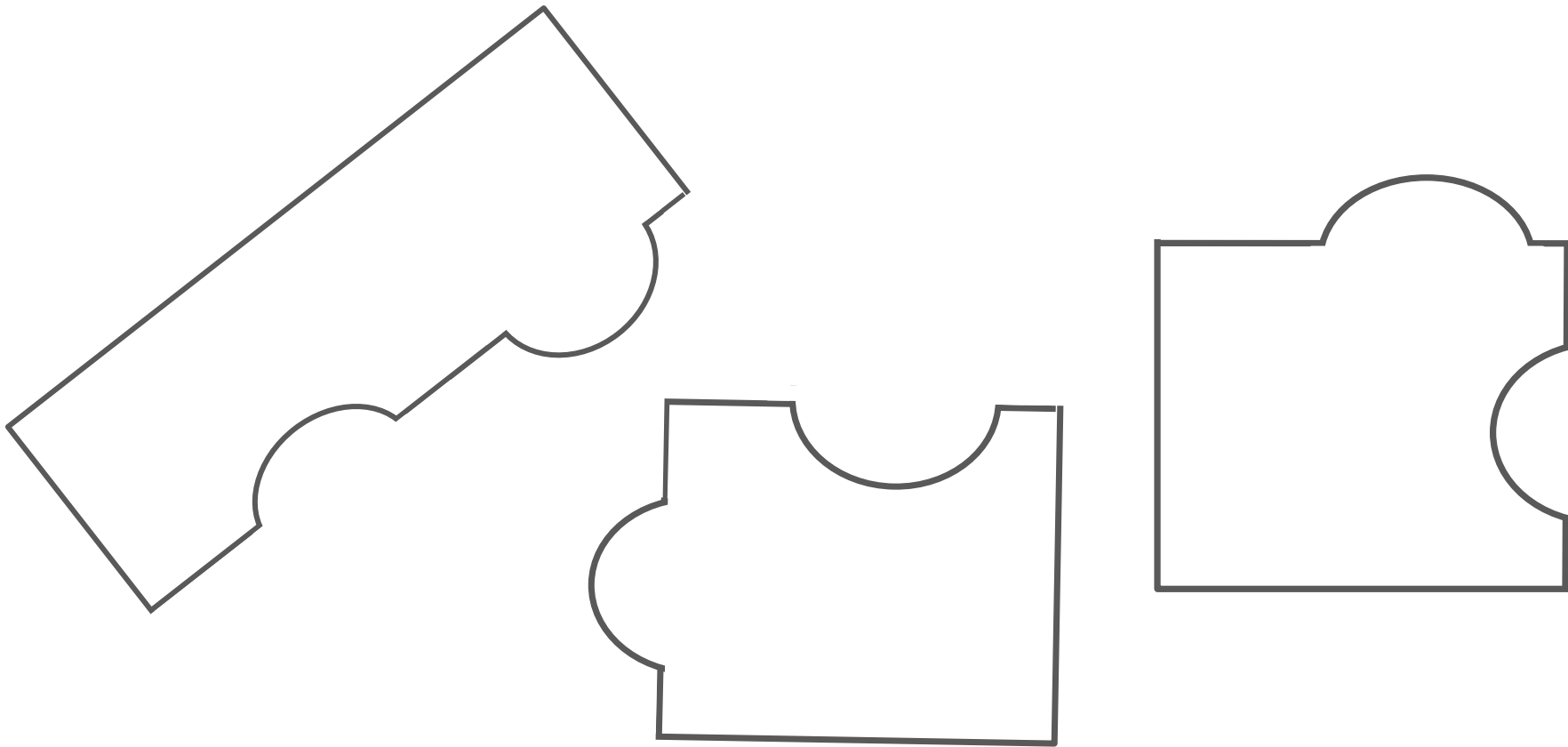


# Visual Model Story Problem Puzzle

## Directions:

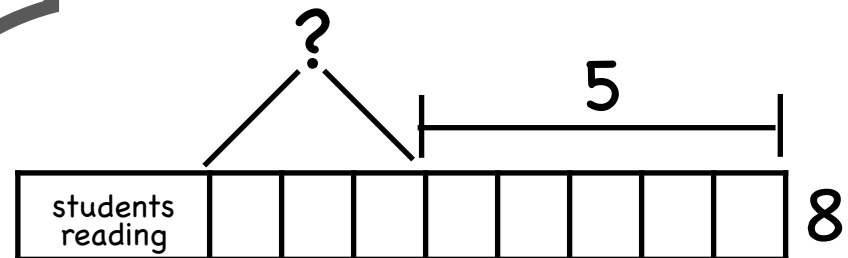
1. Cut out all of the cards.
2. Mix up all the cards and spread them out.
3. Build the 3 different puzzles by finding the word problem, the equation, and the visual model that match.



There are 8 students reading books. Then 5 leave to go to the computer center. How many students are still reading books?

$$8 - 5 = \underline{\quad}$$

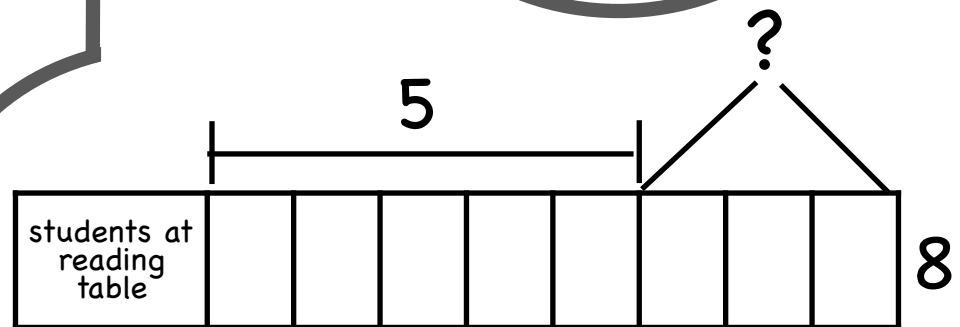
$$\underline{\quad} + 5 = 8$$



There are 8 students at the reading table. 5 of the students are boys and the rest are girls. How many girls are at the reading table?

$$5 + \underline{\quad} = 8$$

$$8 - \underline{\quad} = 5$$



There are 5 students at the reading table and 3 students at the computer table. How many more students are at the reading table than the computer table?

$$5 - 3 = \underline{\quad}$$

$$3 + \underline{\quad} = 5$$



There are 3 boys and 5 girls at the computer table. How many students in all are at the table?

$$3 + 5 = \underline{\quad}$$
