## **Phonics Skills**

**-ed** is a suffix that can be added to different types of words. If **-ed** is added to a *verb* (an action word), it means that the action already has happened. Here are three rules for adding the -ed suffix.

One-One-One Rule	Dropping Rule	Changing Rules
If the base word is 1 syllable and ends with •1 vowel •1 consonant <b>DOUBLE</b> the final consonant and then add -ed.  hug + g+ ed = hug <b>ged</b>	If the base word ends with a silent "e," drop the "e" and then add - ed.  bake + ed = baked	If the base word ends with "y," change the "y" to "i" and then add -ed.  carry + i +ed =carried
