Let's read about maple syrup! First, read and discuss the notes about the **-ure** suffix. Then, circle any words in the passage with **-ure**. Finally, read the passage aloud two times. Try your best to read more smoothly the second time!

From Sap to Syrup

Picture **ture** this! You're on a spring adventure through the woods, when you suddenly stumble upon a grove with buckets hanging from every tree in sight. What's going on here? When the temperature **ture** is warm during the day but still below freezing at night, farmers tap maple trees to capture **ture** sap, a watery liquid that flows through plants. The sap drips into the buckets and is collected to be boiled into sweet, thick maple syrup. Isn't nature **ture** amazing?

About **-URE**

- When T is in front of **-ure**, it often forms a syllable, like in temperature **ture**.
- The letter T sometimes says /ch/ when followed by the letter U.
- The syllable **ture** is pronounced like /cher/ in words with the **-ure** suffix.
