



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Have you ever had two topics that you wanted to compare? Try using a Venn diagram, a graphic organizer, the next time you want to do this.

A Venn diagram has two circles that overlap in the middle to write what is alike, or similar, about the two topics. In the parts of the circles that do NOT overlap, each one is labeled with one of the topics in order to record/write what is different about them.

In this example, Mrs. Mask researched what it means to have a vegetarian diet and a vegan diet. You can see the results below as an example of how to use a Venn diagram to compare two things.
