Answering these questions also gives a purpose for reading the text. Below are some examples of questions to use before, during and after reading. Try these out and then write some of your own to use.

BEFORE READING

What will this book or story be about based on the title and cover? Why?

What do I hope to learn from this book/article?

DURING READING

Do I have a picture in my mind of what is happening?

What is the author trying to tell us?

What is the problem in the story? How do I think it will be solved?

AFTER READING

Did this story remind me of anything I already know about?

Can I retell the story in my own words?

Did I learn anything new from this story/article?
